

# Condensed and Categorized List of Concerns & Questions by Hill Country Community Members

Hays County Meeting, Wimberley, TX Jan. 29, 2019

1. Property devaluation and property rights versus eminent domain.
2. Well-water contamination and air pollution.
3. Aquifer contamination and surface water contamination.
4. Sensitive watershed ecology and karst geology of the hill country and endangered species habitat.
5. Compressor station locations and noise pollution.
6. PIR: Potential Impact Radius.
7. Alternative route options, when will the final route be determined?
8. Fire hazards, explosions, and possible terrorist targets.
9. Repurposing and other materials that could be transported in the pipes and the need for transparency about the specific transported materials.
10. Spread of Oak Wilt resulting in deforestation, which would cause soil erosion and eliminate the natural buffer that reduces storm water runoff and filters contaminated runoff that enters the aquifer.
11. Will this bring in more pipelines through the Hill Country and will more utilities be using the same right of ways?
12. What benefits do the Hill Country residents receive from this pipeline?
13. What percent of this gas will be exported out of the U.S.?
14. Harm to the public and animals by gas leaks and air pollution.
15. How will property owners be notified for all aspects of the project?
16. What is the life of the pipeline?
17. Will Kinder Morgan practice minimum requirements for Best Management Practices (BMP) and maintenance or will it exceed U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) & Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) requirements?
18. Request for an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and a Geologic Survey.
19. Will Kinder Morgan be held responsible for water quality testing and maintaining, if not improving, water quality along the path of the pipeline?
20. If water does become contaminated who will provide water to this heavily populated area?
21. Can Kinder Morgan provide assurance of the total safety of the pipeline?
22. Concerns about Kinder Morgan's negative history with safety issues, pipe leakages, and relations with land owners, etc.
23. The need for resources for the landowners to get organized and understand their options and rights.

24. Some conservation-easement property landowners are in the current planned path of the pipeline and have been given notice by Kinder Morgan of surveying, without Kinder Morgan notifying the land trust that holds the conservation easement.
25. How exactly does Kinder Morgan plan on monitoring pipe leaks?
26. Effects on Hill Country economy and tourism.
27. Concerns with collaboration between Kinder Morgan, local authorities and first responders being appropriately informed and notified in instances where pipe leakages, fire, explosions and other hazmat situations arise.
28. What will be the effects on future generations of Hill Country residents?
29. Concern with make-shift “man camps” created for pipeline workers, which bring drugs, crime, sexual assault, and other dangerous issues.
30. The need for new types of energy like solar and wind instead of oil and gas.
31. Why can't Kinder Morgan just use existing pipeline easements they already have?
32. Will there be protection of historical land marks, Native American burial sites and other tribal areas?
